With more than half the club time gone, Sarah began the Bible Lesson about the life of the Ethiopian Treasurer being "turned around". Joshua and Bryson were captivated, not at all distracted by preschool siblings playing. After the lesson,

both boys were full of questions.

Bryson's mom told Angie, "I am so glad you had this club. I am not a church goer and Bryson is full of questions. I just don't know the answers." Phone numbers were exchanged. Ministry will continue. Angie and Isaac have a deep commitment to sharing Christ with their neighbors. Pray as they seek to engage with the neighborhood kids and families; building relationships of trust and seeking opportunities to share the One who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

A devoted wife of 31 years, mother of a son and daughter, and lifelong resident of Ohio, I am also a certified teacher, a licensed school counselor and social worker, formerly with the Cleveland Public School District. When my son was born, I became a stay-at-home mom. Being active in the church has played a large part in my life. I ran the nursery at First Assembly of God Church in Lyndhurst, then my husband and I were founding members of Word of Grace Church in Chesterland. I later volunteered as the office manager for New Land Covenant Church in Mentor. Presently we are part of a home church with Glean Ministries in Shaker Heights.



My journey with CEF began over 10 years ago as a team member of a Good News Club in Euclid. We met in a cafeteria and all the students walked home after club. A few years later I led a team at Chardon Hills Elementary School also in Euclid. Our team had over 25 students registered, and most all the students were picked up instead of walking home.
